**JLY RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT 2008-2009**  
**PROJECT PROPOSAL #1**

**PROPOSAL:**

It is the recommendation of the Research & Development Committee of 2007-2008 that the Junior League of Youngstown partner with the Mahoning County W.I.C. Program which is part of the Mahoning - Youngstown Community Action Partnership (MYCAP) to expand the “Kids N The Kitchen” day long program. Partnering with W.I.C. will help narrow the League’s target audience and give the League a start to expand upon the program.

**BACKGROUND:**

The “Kids N The Kitchen” program began in 2006 and engages kids in the preparation of healthy meals and educates them plus their families regarding nutrition and health choices. Junior Leagues in more than 255 locations provide lessons and demonstrations related to preparation of healthy meals and snacks in partnership with local community organizations, chefs and nutritionists.

“The goal of the Junior Leagues’ “Kids N the Kitchen” initiative, which is supported by The Association of Junior Leagues International Inc. and its member leagues, is to empower youth to make healthy lifestyle choices and help reverse the growth of childhood obesity and its associated health issues.”

**JUNIOR LEAGUE YOUNGSTOWN INVOLVEMENT:**

- Help plan day-long event: All these would be broken down into sub-committees; Research & Development Committee would chair each of these sub-committees & report back to the Research & Development Chair.
  - Solicit chefs, nutritionists & other community organizations to donate their time for the event
  - Logistics for set-up of participates (pick venue)
  - Coordinate target audience with W.I.C. Program
- **Event Budget:** Over 50% of the Leagues that participate have a \$500 or less

**BENEFITS FOR INVOLVEMENT:**

- The goal of both programs is the same; to help youth live a healthy lifestyle.
- Already have done this program on a smaller scale.

**JLY RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT 2008-2009**  
**PROJECT PROPOSAL #2**

**PROPOSAL:**

It is the recommendation of the Research & Development Committee of 2007-2008 that The Junior League of Youngstown partner with Judge Theresa Dellick/Mahoning County Juvenile Justice Center to establish a "Teen Court."

**BACKGROUND:**

Also known as youth or peer courts, an alternative to juvenile justices and are considered a primary diversion option for young offenders in the juvenile justice system. Offers a venue to which nonviolent and usually first time juvenile offenders are sentenced by their peers.

In 1994 there were 78 youth or teen courts operating. As of August 2002 over 900 youth court programs were operating in 46 states and the District Of Columbia. The teen court concept is generally used for younger juveniles (ages 10 to 15) those with no prior arrest records. Those charged with less serious law violations such as; shoplifting, vandalism and disorderly conduct.

**JUNIOR LEAGUE OF YOUNGSTOWN INVOLVEMENT:**

- Help with recruiting teens to serve on jury that are at least 16 years old (Youth Leadership Mahoning Valley, Service Clubs & National Honor Societies within school system)
- Assist with the strategic plan-timeline, how many times per month court will meet, number of service hours teens will be provided, budget (help with writing grants if need be) NOTE: Research & Development Committee along with JLY President will come up with
- Help with JJC Records office coordinate notices & send notices out, make sure everyone involved such as teen jury, magistrate or judge are notified as well of date of teen court & commit to being there the night of the court (All members of JLY will have to help the night of teen court once it's up & running; looking at Oct. of 2008  
Representative from JLY attend Teen Court Association Meetings at least annually; travel expenses will be included in the budget.
- Assist in the hiring of a permanent Program Coordinator (Case Manager) when the time comes

**NOTE:** Research & Development Committee along with JLY President will come up with

- Help with JJC Records office coordinate notices & send notices out, make sure everyone involved such as teen jury, magistrate or judge are notified as well of date of teen court & commit to being there the night of the court (All members of JLY will have to help the night of teen court once it's up & running; looking at Oct. of 2008
- Representative from JLY attend Teen Court Association Meetings at least annually; travel expenses will be included in the budget.
- Assist in the hiring of a permanent Program Coordinator (Case Manager) when the time comes

**BUDGET:** Max. \$50,000 but start up will be a lot less. As of now, Judge Dellick's JJC has the funding to start Teen Court. JLY will have to come up with initial budget for such things as Paper, Envelopes, Postage, Copies, Program Coordinator, Docking and Security which is all included in the Max. amount which Judge Dellick will take care of the money. NOTE: Lynee Aiad-Toss agreed to act as Project Coordinator (Case Manager) to start the project up in running so initial budget will not include the expense of a project coordinator/case manager.

**BENEFIT FOR INVOLVEMENT:** Make Mahoning Valley history and set a precedent for Trumbull and Columbiana counties.

# *Scribblers*

## **The Magic of Scribblers**

JLY's Scribblers, a monthly gathering of (writing) women at different ages and stages of life, began in 1934. Somewhere it is noted that this happened thanks to Roberta P. Adams, first chairman and "leading light."

God bless her soul.

The formula for our meetings is simple, and simply magical.

But before the magic, here are the basics:

- A couple weeks ahead, the hostess sends out postcards, and (hopefully), everyone R.S.V.P.'s in a timely fashion.
- The hostess then prepares to serve a salad and a dessert, and the attendees prepare sandwiches and (anonymous, to start) writings (poetry or prose, fiction or nonfiction, humor, commentary on current events, etc., etc.). Sometimes one's contribution is a short poem or a couple Haikus; other times, it can be five or six (double-spaced!) pages. When one's life is too hectic for writing, one can take a "bye," and arrive with a TOA (that's "Ticket of Admission," perhaps a hand-written couplet or simple paragraph drafted en route! Technically, one is supposed to limit one's submission of TOAs to one per year, but everyone is understanding and gentle about accommodating the different ages and stages of our lives.)

Those contributions are a bit of the magic, but the true enchantment begins when we gather at noon and share a glass of wine or juice along with good company. Once everyone has arrived, and the sandwiches we've brought have been cut into three or four pieces and placed on platters, we share a meal. Each lady enjoys the hostess's salad and choosing from among the variety of sandwiches (we've brought everything from PB&J to date-nut bread with home-made spreads to pieces of pizza – remember that phrase above re: different ages and stages of life?). Dessert, tea and coffee follow.

Then comes the charm: It's time to read.

The writings are handed out, one to each lady in attendance, and each reads the one she received aloud to the group. We listen, we share observations about what we've heard, we laugh, we cry, and we talk. Oh, goodness, yes – we talk. Sometimes spells are woven; sometimes, we solve all the world's problems. Finally, after all the contributions have been read, we have "Confessions," when each piece and author are identified with one another.

Oh, and one other important basic detail: Typically, our meetings are on the first Monday of the month, eight or nine times a year. We start at noon and, depending on everyone's schedules, sometimes we finish before two, and other times we don't finish until three. Exceptions to that "first Monday" rule are September (2<sup>nd</sup> Monday, thanks to Labor Day) and, occasionally, January (depending on when New Year's falls), and rarely, March and/or April ... when Easter and/or spring break come into play. And while the hostessing schedule is typically set up late each spring for the following year, it isn't written in stone.

Attendance is NOT mandatory (and at this point, white gloves are a thing of the distant past; lots of Scribblers will tell you, my house hasn't always been especially clean when I've hosted – if ever! Again, that bit about ages and stages – but you remember that by now!)

I'm not sure "leading light" Roberta Adams would recognize all the details of a 21<sup>st</sup> century Scribblers gathering, but I know she would enjoy seeing how her brainchild has evolved to handle modern realities while still preserving the magic. If you're curious about experiencing this magic, we'd love to have you join us, for a meeting, a season, or whenever works for you.
